



Say DA to Russian!

Summer 2009 non-credit course

Attend twelve 2-hour sessions, twice a week, on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, 6-8 P.M. at Old Dominion University, Norfolk campus.

Course Description:

Unlike a regular credit course during a school semester, there are no mid-terms, finals, regular tests, mandatory attendance, etc. The instructor reserves the right, however, to give quizzes and home assignments. Attendance is essential but no documentation is required to have absences excused.

The goal of this course is to improve functional competence of the target language (Russian) in speaking, listening, reading, and writing by 1) activating the base grammar, 2) expanding the grammar rules and their application, 3) increasing the learners' active vocabulary. This course is intended to provide learners with the tools necessary for attaining a solid Intermediate Mid level of oral proficiency by perfecting it and taking it up to a higher level.

It is a fun course that is well recommended as an intro to RUS 101, a transition to RUS 201, or a "language exposure" time for all those who need to keep their language skills and abilities updated and utilized. This course is created to continue introducing learners to the Russian language by optimizing classroom time for communicative practice, and providing practical and simple tools of the Russian language skills required for an effective verbal interaction. Instructor will apply the approach of "language immersion" by way of laborious enhancement of learners' listening, speaking, reading and writing skills and abilities through oral drills, games, discussion of grammar principles, written exercises, and reading assignments. This course provides exposure to the Russian language modern vocabulary, pronunciation and grammatical patterns that are necessary for performing basic linguistic tasks.

Although it is a language course, the instructor reserves the right to introduce learners to various aspects of the Russian life that will contribute to a better understanding of the Russian culture in general. The course is learner-centered in several important ways, including without limitation, emphasizing the acquisition of individualized communicative skills, providing learners with a general primer on individual ways of approaching the study of Russian as a foreign language, and supporting instructor's efforts to accommodate different styles within the same classroom.
